Message Handout

Christology

Scripture Luke 24:13-27; 36-49

Creed: "We are endlessly pursuing our understanding of who Christ is as the foundation of our church. Our identity is first shaped by our understanding of Jesus as foreshadowed in the Hebrew scriptures and then fleshed out in his birth, life, death, resurrection and promised second coming. We know that one of the greatest temptations of a church is to create a God in our image that we can bow down and worship in an act of religious self-service. The further we are away from Jesus, the further away we are from a vibrant church."

Missiology

Scripture: John 1:14; 17:18; 20:21

Creed: We understand that our God is missional in nature. Misseo is simply the Latin word for sent. God sends his Spirit, his Torah, his prophets and finally his Son in pursuit of humanity. Joshua Abraham Heschel calls it God in pursuit of man. The scriptures make the claim that as the Father has sent the Son, so the Son sends the church (John 17:18; 20:21). So our identity as the church is rooted in a sent nature in which we are to be and to do for our world what Christ did for his. Just as Jesus became flesh and blood in a specific context so the church as well becomes the hands and feet of Jesus in a specific context. At its core we don't believe that the church is attractional (though it may be attractive) in nature but sent in nature.

Ecclesiogy

Scripture: A Body (1 Cor 12:27); A Bride (Rev 19:7); A Temple (Eph 2:20-22)

Creed: As the church we are sent into a specific context as the body of Jesus. Ecclesiology, the shape of the church, is the result of following Jesus into our city and doing what he would do. While there are the normal practices of the historic church, baptism and eucharist, we believe that a church focused on mission will have no specific strategy or method that all churches should follow. This creates a lot of room for flexibility in how things are done. If our ecclesiology does not cause us to look sacrificial like the cross and full of hope like an empty tomb then it needs to change.

Next Sunday: We will begin our study of Christology in be in Philippians 2:5-11 for the next four weeks.

We'll definitely have a lot of time to read the bible together and pray together (we will even begin some missional activities together in a few weeks) but do you have anything else you could see us doing that would help bring us together?: eg. Wii bowling, Movie Night, BBQing...Real Tennis...etc...
